Summary:

On July 9, 2019, Port Commission awarded the NE Campus 2 Building to Henderson Partners, LLC. The base bid consisted of the site development of a 1.71-acre parcel and the construction of a 17,433 sf warehouse. The base bid was \$1,615,688.

A final acceptance inspection was completed by Port staff and Soundwest Engineering Associates on September 1, 2020.

There were six (6) change orders throughout the project. CO-1 was to modify the footings for the Nucor Building that was erected @ \$11,549.83. CO-2 was to modify the fire line to meet City of Bremerton code @ \$5,179.85. CO-3 was to purchase and install a pressure reducing valve @ \$1,988.20. CO-4 was for the installation of the irrigation system for landscaping @ \$29,943.39. CO-5 was for the installation for the Geo-fabric for structural stability under the pavement @ \$29,197.06. CO-6 was for the installation of safety railings around the electrical panels, fire and communication panels, and fire suppression system @ \$5,995.

Total construction costs, including change orders and WSST is \$1,696,541.33.

Fiscal Impact:

Total project cost including design, engineering, permitting, and construction was \$2,155,732.55. The project budget was \$3,000,000 which resulted cost efficiencies to the port of \$844,267.45.

This project was completed within the budgeted amount.

Strategic Purpose:

Goal 1: Be a significant leader in promoting the local economy and job growth both on and off Port assets. The Port is an economic engine. It is authorized to build and operate facilities as well as provide more programmatic support to the community's efforts to increase job growth.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends accepting as final the construction contract with Henderson Partners, LLC., in the amount of \$1,696,541.33. The Port will release retainage once all applicable documentation is received.
