Summary:

In 2021 the Port of Bremerton, assisted by Columbia Hospitality, commenced with a search for a tenant for the new restaurant at Bremerton National Airport. Morris Restaurant Management was chosen to be the new proprietor of the restaurant and they will be opening Amelia's Hangar this year. Morris Restaurant Management successfully operates three other facilities. Over the past few months, owners Don and Rena Morris have worked closely with Port Staff in finalizing the lease and working with Port staff to ensure that they are able to personalize the restaurant and ensure a smooth transition to their opening.

Lease Terms:

- Lease Commencement: 1st day of the month following Occupancy Permit received by City of Bremerton
- Seven (7) year lease
- Two (2) options of seven (7) years each
- Annual CPI Adjustments
- Base Rent is subject to periodic adjustments every seven (7) years
- Lease Rate:
 - o Months 1 6 \$2,000.00* 2.5% of Gross Receipts Over \$150,000*
 - o Months 7 8 \$2,000.00* 2.5% of Gross Receipts Over \$100,000*
 - o Months 9 Remaining Term \$2,000.00*

2.5% of all Gross Receipts up to \$200,000* PLUS 1.5% of all Gross Receipts over \$200,000*

Port staff has done their due diligence and finds Morris Restaurant Management in good standings. The lease was written, reviewed, and approved by legal.

Fiscal Impact:

Increased annual revenue for Bremerton National Airport. Based on historical data for this location, average annual rent is estimated at \$51,500 and 16 new jobs are anticipated. The estimated rent is \$33,080 over the previous lease at this location and does not include the leases for the aviation business office and hangar.

Strategic Purpose:

This action conforms with the Port's strategic plan in Goal 4.a. to continually assess niche markets in the Port's Marina and Airfield lines of business for growth opportunities.

Recommendation:

Port staff recommends the approval of the restaurant lease between Morris Restaurant Management, LLC, and the Port of Bremerton as presented.

Summary:

The 20-year-old Avian Flight Center Hangar is located at 8900 SW State Hwy 3, adjacent to Port Headquarters. Constant water leaks from the second story row of windows on the south wall of the hangar have required repeated maintenance since initial construction. Multiple solutions have been attempted over the years. The continuing leaks and the age of the building now directly interfere with Avian maintenance activities (see Exhibit A photos), demanding that the windows be replaced. The Port established Public Works Project #02-22-20002 to replace these windows (see Exhibit B photo) and solicited electronic bids from 19 contractors identified in Municipal Research and Services Center (MSRC) rosters.

The closing date for submissions was May 26, 2022. Only one bid was received. K.E.D. Inc DBA Dahl Glass of Poulsbo, WA offered its bid, including sales tax, for \$63,578.42. Construction duration is 130 days.

Port staff has experience with Dahl Glass. This firm is in the process of replacing other windows in the Port office building and also serves as the primary window subcontractor on the new Multipurpose Facility. The company has a significant level of expertise in commercial window installations with favorable reviews on quality of work, schedule, and ability to remain within budget.

Fiscal Impact:

This is a 2022 Maintenance & Operations (M&O) budget project.

2022 Budget – Facility Replacement/Maintenance (Airport):\$149,340.00Funds Remaining:129,223.00Construction Contract:63,578.42Funds Remaining Post Project:\$ 65,644.58

Strategic Purpose:

This action conforms with the Port's strategic plan in:

• Goal 6: Develop and fund a 20-year asset replacement/major maintenance schedule.

Recommendation:

Port staff recommends the bid award for the Avian Hangar 8900 Window Replacement construction contract to K.E.D. Inc. DBA Dahl Glass.
