


Making Moves

Notice of Suquamish Tribe Fishing at Port Orchard Marina

The Suguamish Tribe's commercial Chinook salmon season began in July and may continue throughout September. Many fishing vessels are moored in Port Orchard Marina's quest moorage during this time.

Nets are most often set at night and can be identified by small white corks on the surface, marked at either end with larger orange or red buoys. Boaters are asked to remain alert and exercise caution when navigating local waters throughout this season.

Rebecca Raney is a woman of many talents: a successful businesswoman who spent twenty years as the owner of Port Orchard's beloved Yes Please Coffee, a Certified Flight Instructor at Avian Flight Center, and soon-to-be commercial pilot for Horizon Air. While her coffee business was a long-standing labor of love, her flight experience has been nothing short of remarkable: a second career that began less than three years ago.

Meet Rebecca Raney

Rebecca grew up in Gig Harbor and built deep ties to the Kitsap community. Together with her husband, she invested in commercial property and built Yes Please Coffee from the ground up,



turning it into a cornerstone of Port Orchard. For two decades, she poured her energy into community partnerships, mentoring employees, and keeping a bustling small business running. As her daughter prepared for college, though, Rebecca and her husband knew it was time for a change. Selling the property gave them financial flexibility and opened the door to new dreams.

Taking the Sky by Storm

Rebecca had always been curious about aviation, especially after seeing former employees pursue careers with the airlines. With encouragement from friends, she signed up for a Discovery Flight at KPWT's Avian Flight Center in January of 2022. That short flight over the Puget Sound left her exhilarated.





"I came down feeling true adrenaline," Rebecca recalled. "It didn't scare me, it just recharged me."

What began as a personal challenge quickly grew into a new career path. She enrolled in ground school that Spring, balancing her final year as a business owner with flight training. By early 2003, she had earned her private pilot's license, followed by her instrument rating, commercial license, CFI, and multi-engine training. She describes it as an "all-in" commitment, one that demanded the same discipline, maintenance mindset, and attention to detail she had honed as a business owner, but in an entirely new arena.

Beyond her training, Rebecca also immersed herself in aviation's supportive community. Early on she joined the Ninety-Nines, an international organization of women pilots, on the search to find camaraderie and mentorship. What started as being "the mentee" soon turned into her mentoring others, from Avian students to scholarship applicants. She also takes pride in inspiring young women: one of her most memorable discovery flights she lead was with a 13-year-old girl whose grandmother was moved to tears watching her granddaughter take the controls for the first time. Rebecca says these moments reaffirm her belief that "we are raising young women to believe they can do anything."

Soaring Beyond

Rebecca's dedication and persistence recently paid off when she was accepted into the Horizon Air Pilot Development Program. The program provides mentorship, company training connections, and a direct path to the flight deck once she builds the 1,500 flight hours required for her Airline Transport Pilot Certificate. Her dream is to fly for Horizon Air out of SeaTac to Paine Field, operating the Embraer 175 jet she already admires.

While Rebecca is excited for the airline career ahead, she remains grateful for her time teaching and working at Avian, where her journey began. Her story reflects not only the courage to make a bold midlife career change, but also the importance of community, mentorship, and saying 'yes' to new possibilities.

As Rebecca puts it, the philosophy behind her coffee shop name still guides her: "Yes Please."
