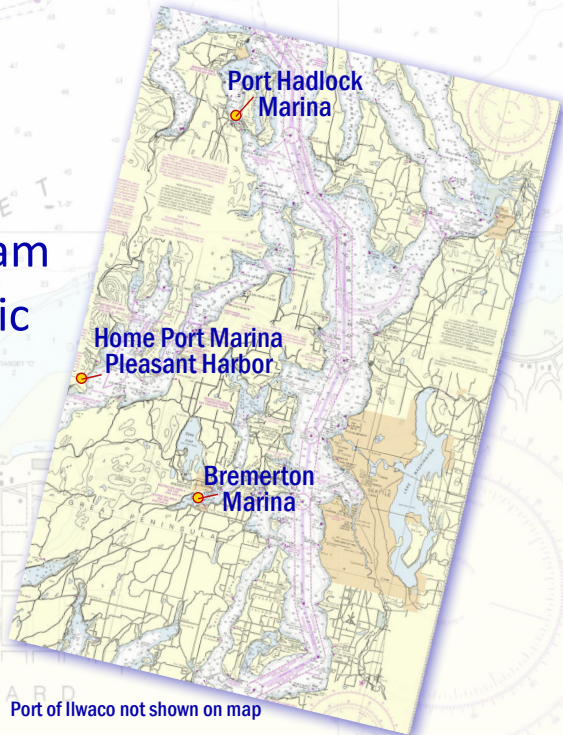

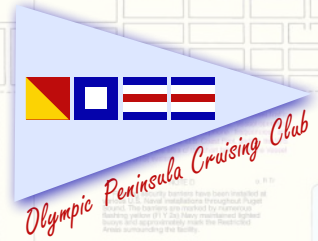

## What is it?

The Olympic Peninsula Cruising Club is a value-add available to all our tenants. Just as yacht clubs offer reciprocal rights to members at other yacht clubs, we are offering reciprocal rights to our tenants at some beautiful Puget Sound locations, allowing you to cruise the Sound without additional moorage fees.



## Where can I go?

Currently we have three locations giving our tenants reciprocal rights:

- Port Hadlock Marina, close to Port Townsend
- The Home Port Marina in Pleasant Harbor, centrally located in Hood Canal
- Emerald Yachts in quaint, downtown Gig Harbor

## When can I go?

Anytime you want! Even during the prime cruising times of July, August and September. Of course, it's subject to availability at those locations.

## How do I make a reservation?

Simply call the Bremerton Marina Office at 360-373-1035

## Can I reserve online?

No, not at this time.

## How far out can I make a reservation?

60 days

## Are there limits to how long I can stay at any one marina?

Yes, two consecutive nights.

## Are there limits to how many times in a year I can visit any marina?

You may visit each facility up to IRXU times per year. This gives you the right to a total of 24 nights at reciprocal properties!

## Do I have to pay for anything?

Power, showers and other incidentals that the marinas charge their tenants.
